## Big Milestones in February

Help Me Grow North Texas experienced two major milestones in the month of February.

#### 5,000 families served

At the end of February, Help Me Grow North Texas hit 5,000 families served by the Centralized Access Point (CAP)/Family Navigators. Thank you to all of our partners who have referred families and make these efforts possible! The Help Me Grow North Texas CAP will celebrate its second birthday on April 1. #### Parker County Family Resource Center

My Health My Resources of Tarrant County was awarded a four-year grant from the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, Prevention and Early Intervention division, that started on January 1, 2022, to establish a family resource center in Parker County. Family resource centers are a one-stop shop for community support services for families to access. The centers are designed based on the community's unique needs, offer a variety of services for families, and include family/parent leadership as a key element of design and implementation. The Parker County Family Resource Center opened on March 24th and is open to all families within Parker County to access Family Navigation, Early Childhood Intervention, education groups and Parent Cafes, basic needs support, and parent leadership opportunities.

The Parker County Family Resource Center is made possible through partnership with Springtown ISD. The address is 314 E 5th Terrace, Springtown, TX 76082.
