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Program Highlight My Health My Resources of Tarrant County Mental Health Consultation Program

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The Mental Health Consultation Program from My Health My Resources of Tarrant County's Early Childhood Services is a free program and resource for child care centers and family child care homes in Cooke, Denton, Wise, Tarrant, Hood, Parker, Somervell, Erath, Ellis, Johnson, Palo Pinto, and Navarro counties. The mental health consultants are master's level, licensed mental health professionals that have expertise in promoting healthy relationships, environments, and supporting children within the classroom. The mental health consultants work with directors and teachers to help create the best possible environment for the children in their care.

The mental health consultants utilize the below model that focuses on children accessing mental health supports within their natural environments like a child care classroom, builds capacity of the providers that work directly with the families to help improve their environment, and builds successful outcomes for children in learning and relationships. The program focuses on working with centers and children under the age of six. The mental health consultants also utilize Trust Based Relational Intervention.

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Developmental Milestones Academy Opportunity in Review

On June 12 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. The Early Childhood Services Family Engagement and Groups team at My Health My Resources of Tarrant County (MHMR) hosted a free virtual professional development opportunity. The Act Early Milestone Academy allowed 19 child care providers to come together and go through specific milestones, strategies, and exercises based on different ages of the children providers work with. Mental Health Consultants from MHMR Tarrant supported Trust Based Relational Intervention (TBRI) practices throughout the academy. Attendees were taught how to download and use the Milestone Tracker App within their classroom. Additional information was shared on Parent Cafés, Power Groups, and incorporating protective factors into their work with families.

Attendees were asked to fill out a survey after the event to share about their experience. Attendees shared that the most beneficial information that they learned was related to TBRI, protective factors, behavior support and how to use the CDC Milestone Tracker app. Most attendees also shared that they will use the information they used they learned quite a bit and that it had a huge impact on their practice of working with children within their center. This Milestone Academy was the first to be held from MHMR Tarrant staff and more are being planned for the near future.



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
